Please note that the Competition Pool will be closed for warm up 15 minutes prior to the commencement of each session. We ask that swimmers clear the water when the announcement is made to enable the pool to be readied for competition.

We will ask all accreditation holders to clear the venue 30min post the conclusion of every session.

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# PROGRAM OF EVENTS & QUALIFYING TIMES

## PROGRAM OF EVENTS

- The Program of Events can be found under Competition Information on the event page of the website [HERE](#)
- This event will be conducted in a 10-lane pool, using 10 lanes for heats and 8 lanes for finals. There will be B-Finals up to and including 200m events provided at least 24 swimmers contest the heats
- Heats will be swum in the order of fastest heat to slowest heat, with the exception of the distance events
- Distance events (800m and 1500m) are timed finals with the slow heat/s in the morning (swum fastest to slowest) and the fastest heat contested in the evening finals session
- There are no relay events at this meet

## QUALIFYING TIMES

- All qualifying times must be achieved before the closing date. Only Long Course times can be used to enter this meet

- Age is determined by the swimmer's age as at Monday 8<sup>th</sup> June 2026
- The minimum age for swimmers competing is 13 years and 12 years for MC swimmers



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# ENTRY PROCEDURES

Entries close at 12:00noon (midday) AEST Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> May.

Late Entries may be accepted for a limited time only at the discretion of Swimming Australia. Entry times for late entries must be achieved prior to the original closing date as advertised above and online. Times achieved after this date will not be accepted, regardless of accessibility in Swim Central. Refunds will not be provided.

A 'Late Entry Meet' will open in Swim Central at 12noon AEST on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> May. Late entries will incur additional fees and will close at 5pm AEST Friday 29<sup>th</sup> May.

If you have already submitted your entries on time, please DO NOT re-submit them as you will be charged higher fees and refunds are not available.

No further late entries will be accepted after 5pm Friday May 29<sup>th</sup> under any circumstances.

## APPLYING FOR ACCREDITATION

We have made some changes to the accreditation process and pass types this year to better match the new MC Age, Aus Open and Age Champs format. Please read the information below before proceeding with your application. Full details can be found [HERE](#).

Accreditation applications close at **11:59pm AEST Wednesday 27th May, 2025**.

Accreditation applications must be made by the due date. Applications received after the date noted above **WILL NOT** be accepted under any circumstances.

**Athletes will automatically receive accreditation from their online entries and are not required to apply.**

## IMPORTANT CHANGE IN APPLICATIONS FOR TEAM MANAGER PASSES

A club representative must complete the provided JotForm, that can be found via the link below for each of their team manager nominations. Once the information has been verified, team managers will then be formally nominated by Swimming Australia staff through Swim Central. Nominees will be required to log in to Swim Central to accept the nomination and complete payment to confirm their position.

Accreditation applications must be made in advance and **WILL NOT** be accepted onsite.

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# ACCREDITATION

## ACCREDITATION TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- Accreditation can be collected from the main foyer entrance of the Aquatic Centre
- Accreditation passes must be worn on pool deck to allow you access to certain spaces. Event staff and security personnel will regularly check accreditation passes
- Accreditation passes and/or lanyards are not interchangeable. Anyone who is found passing on or changing lanyards or accreditations will be in breach of the terms and conditions of being issued with an accreditation pass and will have their pass **revoked immediately**
- We encourage Team Managers to collect accreditations for the whole club to avoid long lines at the accreditation booth
- Any accreditations that need reprinting onsite will incur a \$25 reprint fee (this includes if you left it at your accommodation)
- A photo of your accreditation will not grant you entry to the venue
- Please also remember to collect your accreditation post race at the Accreditation collection tables on pool deck. Any unclaimed passes at the end of a session will be returned to the accreditation booth outside the accreditation entrance

## ATHLETE ACCREDITATION PHOTOS

Swimmers will now have the option of including their photo on their accreditation pass for National Championship events. Instructions for uploading your photo can be found under the Accreditation menu header [HERE](#).

## MC CARERS PASS

MC Carer passes at this meet are restricted to swimmers with an 'A' or 'T' exception. This is aimed at promoting self-sufficient swimmers who exhibit the values and behaviours of an athlete performing at a National level championship.

If you don't believe your swimmer is ready for this level of exposure, regardless of making the qualification standards, please consider this when making the decision to attend.

There will be an area accessible outside of the accredited zone for both parents and athletes to use for athlete swimsuit assistance.



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# RULES & EVENT PROCEDURES

## RULES

- The 2026 Australian Swimming Trials will be conducted under the Swimming Australia Championship Rules and Competition Regulations, World Aquatics Swimming Rules and WPS Swimming Rules
- Heats will start over the top for all strokes including backstroke with the exception of Multi Class events where the pool will be cleared between each heat
- The pool will also be cleared at the conclusion of each event for the summary to be shown on the scoreboard
- 10 lanes will be used for heats, 8 lanes will be used for finals
- As this is a selection event, Visitors will not progress to A finals at this meet, however, unlimited visitors may progress to B finals, including Multi-Class events. For a full understanding of our visitor policy, please review Competition Rule 11 of our [Competition Regulations](#)
- Where a visitor places ahead of an Australian swimmer, places will be adjusted accordingly. This may result in some athletes with a slower time showing 'above' another athlete with a faster time. For a full understanding of this process, please review Competition Rule 25.1 of our [Competition Regulations](#)
- This meet will not be scored

## PROTESTS

Protests must be submitted as follows:

- To the Referee
- In writing on the Swimming Australia protest form setting out the reasons for the protest
- By the responsible Team Leader
- Together with a deposit of \$100.00 AUD
- Within 30 minutes following the conclusion of the respective event
- If conditions causing a potential protest are noted prior to the event, a protest must be lodged before the starting signal is given
- If the Referee rejects the protest, they must state the reasons for this decision. The Team Leader may appeal the rejection to the Jury of Appeal whose decision shall be final.



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# RULES & EVENT PROCEDURES

## MULTI CLASS ATHLETES

- Multi Class athletes are not required to report to the Referee with their classification card
- Multi Class athletes do not need to apply for any Australian records broken at this meet as they will be automatically processed following the completion of the meet
- Multi Class events will be swum as Open Heats and Finals

## NAMES ON SCOREBOARD

Due to the specialised timing equipment for Multi-Class events, some swimmer's names may appear incomplete on the scoreboard & on the live results page. This will be rectified when the final results are published online after the event.

## FINALS

A Finals will be swum before B Finals. B Finals will be held during ad breaks and during broadcast pre-recorded packages, meaning they will not feature on the broadcast coverage. Please remember we are completing live sports broadcasting; therefore, ad breaks, interviews and key feature packages will be in the coverage. Coaches and athletes are highly encouraged to check the scoreboard and monitor the WhatsApp group for updates regarding any changes to the advertised timeline.

## RESULTS:

Results will be posted:

- In the corridor outside the marshalling area
- Live Results on Swimming Australia Website and via Meet Mobile\*
- Via the Meet Info WhatsApp group

\*Results published on Meet Mobile are seen as provisional only and are considered “unofficial” at all times.



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# WITHDRAWALS & MARSHALLING

## WITHDRAWAL FORM PROCESS

- Withdrawal forms for both Heats and Finals can be collected from and returned to the Help Desk
- Any swimmer wishing to withdraw from a final must do so within 30 minutes of the results of that event being posted
- If you do not wish to be considered for a place in an A or B final after swimmers above you withdraw, please go to the Help Desk and complete a withdrawal form
- **Please note that once a withdrawal form has been submitted, it cannot be withdrawn**
- Late withdrawals from finals will incur a \$100 fee that must be paid before your next swim at any SwimAus meet. This also includes the fastest heat of timed finals

## MARSHALLING PROCEDURES

### HEATS AND TIMED FINALS

Self-Marshalling will be in place for all heats and timed finals (for finals, fastest heats of timed finals, and relay events refer below). Swimmers will be instructed by the check starter to move behind the blocks once the race ahead of them has entered the water. Athlete accreditation passes must be brought to marshalling and collected from the Accreditation Collection Table after each race. An overflow space (marshalling room) will be available for swimmers to ready themselves prior to their race.

### SWIMMERS WILL ONLY BE PERMITTED TO ENTER THE SELF-MARSHALLING AREA AS FOLLOWS:

50m events	8 heats prior to their heat
100m & 200m events	4 heats prior to their heat
400m events	2 heats prior to their heat
800m & 1500m events	1 heat prior to their heat



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# WITHDRAWALS & MARSHALLING

## THERE WILL BE CHECK STARTERS ON HAND TO DIRECT THE SWIMMERS TO THE POOL DECK

Swimmers may approach the Help Desk for assistance or ask their club manager or coach.

Multi Class Athletes with an 'A' or 'T' exception code only are eligible to have a MC Carer in the Marshalling Room with them.

## ALL FINALS INCLUDING FASTEST HEAT OF TIMED FINALS AND RELAY EVENTS WILL BE MARSHALLED IN THE SELF-MARSHALLING AREA

Any swimmer entered in the first or second event in each finals session, who fails to report to the marshalling area at least 10 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the session, may be deemed to be a withdrawal.

For all subsequent finals, any swimmer who fails to report by the start of the event at least two events prior to their event, may be deemed to be a withdrawal.

## BROADCAST REMINDER

A reminder to athletes that there will be a live recording camera in the marshalling room, as well as hosts and commentary personnel recording live at the front of the room. Please be aware of this when adjusting swimsuits/dressing, etc



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# ONLINE CHECK IN: 400m, 800m & 1500m EVENTS

The 800m and 1500m freestyle events are timed finals with the fastest heat swum in the finals session. As per Competition Regulation CR 19.2, swimmers for all heats of 800m and 1500m events, including the fastest heat to be swum in the finals session are required to declare their intent to swim by **no later than one hour prior** to the scheduled start time of these events in the heats session as noted on the timeline.

The 400m freestyle and 400m individual medley events have been added to this requirement for this and all future meets. Swimmers are required to declare their intent to swim by **no later than one hour prior** to the scheduled start time of these events in the heats session.

Swimmers, coaches and team managers will be able to check in via the QR code on their phones, tablets etc, or via the QR code which will be posted around the venue.

You will need access to your email to confirm your identity. Once you click on the QR code, you will need to fill out the form and confirm your intention to swim or withdraw from your event then submit the form. Once your form has been submitted, you will receive a confirmation email for your records. Please check your spam folder in the event it doesn't come through to your inbox.

The ability to check in online will cease **one hour prior** to the scheduled start time of each 400m, 800m & 1500m event in each heats session.

Online check in for your 400m, 800m & 1500m events will be available 48 hours prior to the day of your event.

A reminder that once a withdrawal has been submitted it cannot be reversed.



**Swimmers, Coaches or Team Managers must either use the QR code or check-in at the Help Desk during the heats session, failure to do so will be deemed a withdrawal.**

If you do not receive a confirmation email, you may not have submitted the form correctly. You will need to submit the form again and remember to press the 'submit' button at the end of the form.



# WARM-UP PROCEDURES

Please refer to the below training schedule for availability in the competition pool, the dive pool and the training pool.

The competition pool will be available for two hours before the commencement of each session for those athletes competing in that session only.

**No paddles or fins to be used in competition pool.**

The following general pool procedures for the **COMPETITION POOL (50m)** must be observed throughout the meet:

Lanes 0 and 9	Reserved for dive sprints from the start end of the pool. Swimmers must clear the lane immediately
Lanes 1 and 8	Reserved for pace swimming, feet first entry (no diving)
Lanes 2 & 3	Reserved as <b>MC Only</b>
Lanes 4-7	Reserved as circle swimming lanes, feet first entry

The following general pool procedures for the **TRAINING POOL (50m)** must be observed throughout the meet: (STRICTLY NO DIVING)

Lanes 1 and 8	Reserved as <b>MC Only</b>
Lanes 2 and 3	Reserved for pace swimming, feet first entry (no diving)
Lanes 4 -7	Reserved as circle swimming lanes, feet first entry

The Diving pool will be used for warm-up and will have allocated dive start lanes and pace lanes (marked with signs)

In addition to the procedures above, please be aware of announcements to determine lane usage throughout the meet. Swimming Australia reserves the right to adjust lane usage if deemed appropriate



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# GENERAL INFORMATION

## PROGRAMS

- SwimAus will no longer be providing hard copy Heats programs. The Heats Program will be published online for you to download and print as needed
- Finals Programs will be available online to download after each Heats session and will be shared in the WhatsApp group as soon as it is available each day. **Limited** hard copies will be printed for coaches, and we encourage you to download the online version instead
- All Timelines should be used as a guide only and SwimAus takes no responsibility for swimmers missing their events. A digital timeline will be shared in the coaches WhatsApp group and published online after heats each day and we encourage athletes and coaches to following along the events and heats currently in the water to be mindful of your marshalling requirements

## MEDAL COLLECTION

There will be no dedicated medal ceremonies at this event. More information in regard to medal collection will be published closer to the event date.

## BASKET HANDLERS

There will be Basket Handlers in place for this event during the A Final events only. Baskets will be located near the diving pool (refer to maps when finalised).

## WHATSAPP INFORMATION GROUP

- An Information group has been created in WhatsApp for all coaches, team managers, swimmers, parents and carers to join to receive important updates throughout the event as well as copies of official results, programs and timelines as soon as they are available, and/or edited

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# GENERAL INFORMATION

## MEDICAL

The Pool Lifeguards will assist with emergencies in the first instance. Swimming Australia's medical attendant Mark McCarthy will be on pool deck during the event. The First Aid location will be confirmed closer to the event date. For information on medical facilities in the area please see a venue staff member onsite.

## PHOTOGRAPHY/CAMERAS:

The only photography allowed in the venue is by accredited media, as approved by the events team of Swimming Australia. Accredited photographers will be signed in and allocated a Swimming Australia bib. Any unauthorised person found on pool deck will be subject to removal from the venue. Swimming Australia has adopted a Working With Children Check (Blue Card in Qld) as a prerequisite for all media allowed at this meet.

In accordance with Swimming Australia's safeguarding and member protection policies, DSLR and professional-style cameras are not permitted within the venue, except by Swimming Australia accredited photographers.

## TEAM SELECTION

This event will form part of the selection process for the 2026 Commonwealth Games, the 2026 Pan Pacific Championships and the 2026 Para Pan Pacific Championships. For more information on team selection please check [HERE](#). Team announcements will be made on Night 6.

## MASSAGE/PHYSIO BEDS

- Physio spaces will be indicated on maps when finalised
- Physio beds can be left there overnight and between sessions but at your own risk

- Space around the warm-up pool/dive pool is not allocated and cannot be reserved. Swimmers and clubs are advised that they cannot reserve space or leave items overnight due to the cleaners needing access

- Media, social and broadcast interviews to camera may take place throughout the event, please ensure you make yourself available when asked
- B Finals will not be broadcast/streamed

- Team Announcements will take place on the final night at the end of the session and will be presented on pool deck

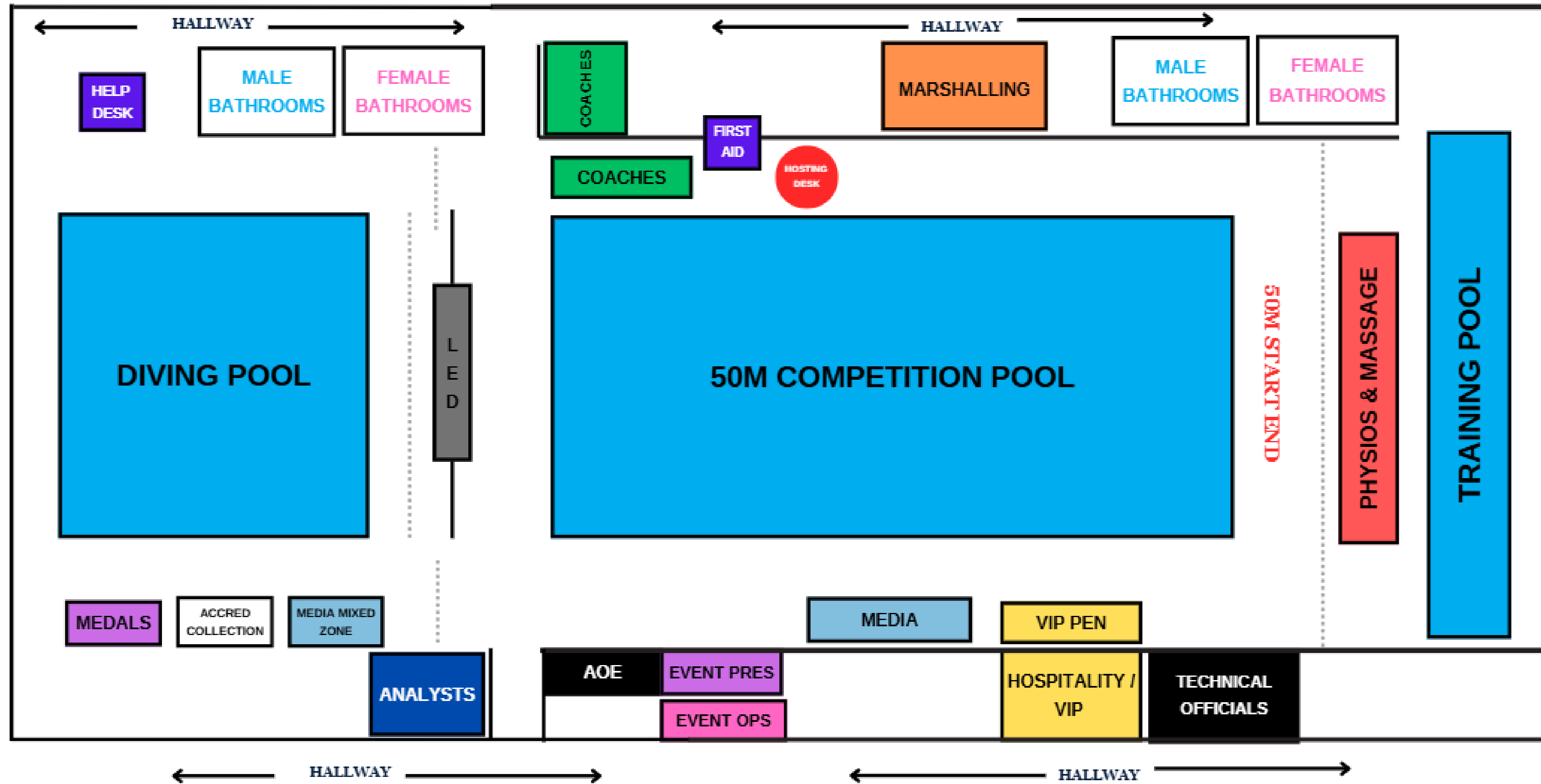

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# VENUE MAP: POOL DECK AREAS

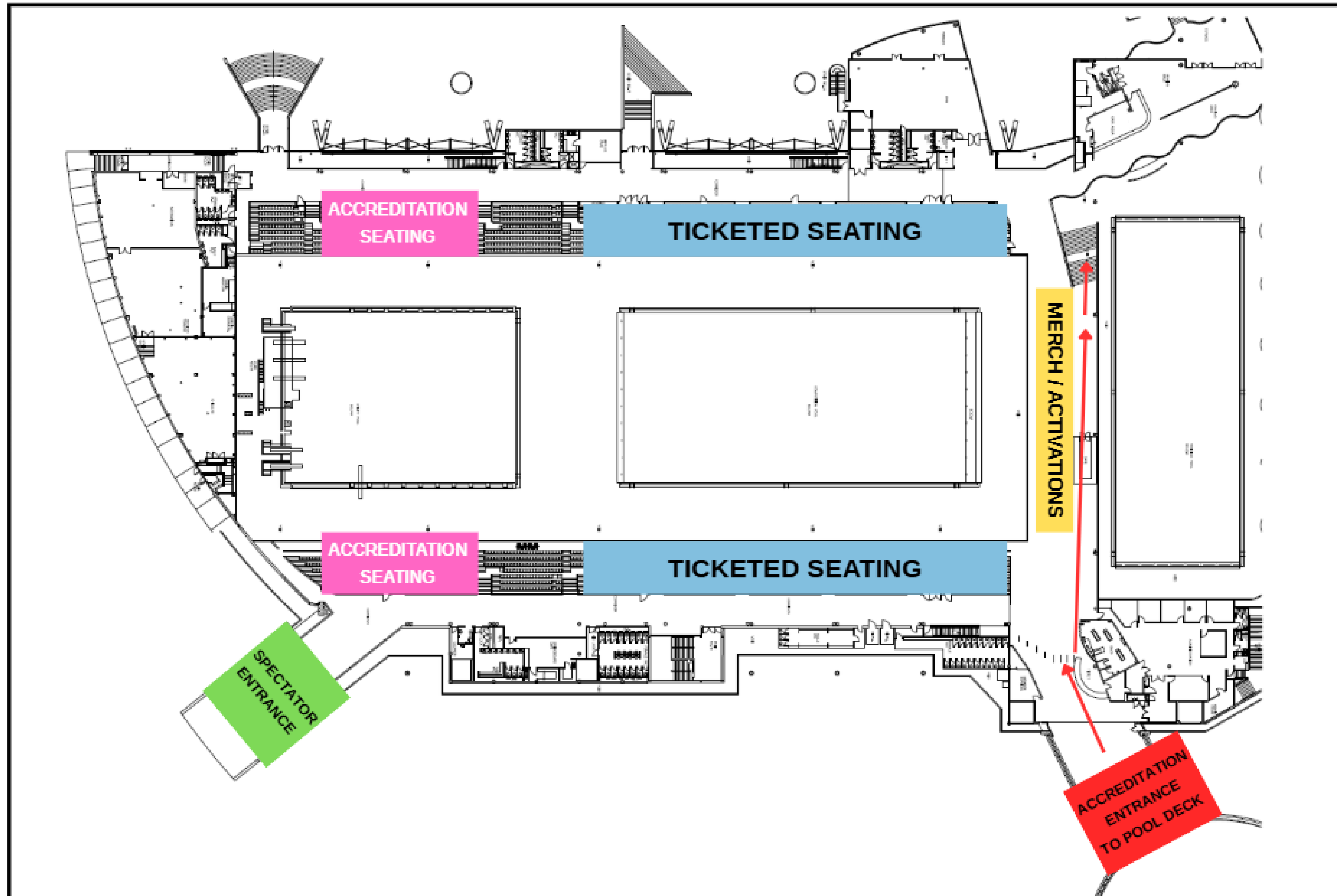
## POOL DECK OVERLAY
