## Entry Information

Swimming New Zealand policies and the New Zealand swimming rules govern this competition.

This meet is open to financial, registered (at the time of competition) Swimming New Zealand Competitive Swimmers and foreign swimmers registered with foreign FINA affiliated swimming federations. All participants must agree to comply with the Sports Anti-Doping Rules.

Please note that this event will not be able to be hosted if the government has announced the country is under Alert Level 2 or above.

### Entry Process

All entries must be submitted via the SNZ Fast Lane page. Individuals will be able to access and complete their entries online via their Fast Lane.

There is no limit on the number of individual event entries.

Late entries will be accepted for 24hrs only via the Fast Lane page. A late entry fee will be applied in addition to individual entry fees.

### Qualification Criteria

Age as at 30 April 2021. Must be 13+ years

The qualifying period is from 1 January 2019 to 23 March 2021.

The qualifying times are 50m long course times. Long course times as well as short course [conversions](#) can be used for qualification. All swimmers shall only enter qualified events.

Results from both approved and unapproved meets will be able to be used as qualifying times.

Individual entry times will be generated by the SNZ Database. Performances from international, regional and local competitions not held within the database will not be eligible for use to enter this championship.

Entry fees must be paid prior to the start of the meet. If they have not been paid it will result in the withdrawal of swimmers. Clubs that have not paid the required entry fees at the closing date of entries will be invoiced by Swimming New Zealand.

No refunds for any withdraws before or during the meet. Refunds for any medical withdrawals can be considered if a signed doctor's certificate is supplied.

### International Entries

Visitors will be able to submit entries using either a TM File or spreadsheet available on the event website. This need to be emailed to [entries@swimming.org.nz](mailto:entries@swimming.org.nz) by the entry deadline date specified above.

Foreign entries also need to be accompanied with a signed Travel Authorisation Form/Letter from the national federation.

Foreign clubs are required to provide a proof of entries report upon submission of entries.

A maximum of two (2) international visitors may progress from heats to finals in any one event. There is no limit on international visitor entries for timed-finals but only two (2) international visitors may swim in the fastest timed-final.

International Para Swimmers must hold a National classification or higher and present their classification card to the Technical Director prior to the competition starting.

## Event Specifications

### Heats

Heats will be swum in the morning sessions, with open and 17/18 years mixed together.

### Finals

Final	Swimmers
A Final	8 fastest
B Final	9 - 16 fastest (Held if 20 swims in heats)
C Final	17 - 24 fastest (Held if 30 swims in heats)

The open championship placings will be determined from the A final. C and B finals will not score at this championship. **Please note that C and B Finals will be swum prior to the A Finals.** All A, B and C Final swimmers will be marshalled at the same time.

The 17/18 years placings will be determined from the fastest three swimmers from any of the A, B or C finals.

Please note there will be no 17/18 years final in isolation.

### Timed Finals

The 800m Free and 1500m Free for both Males and Females will be swum as timed finals with the only the fastest timed final swum in the final's session of that particular day.

### Para Athletes

The 2021 Aon New Zealand Swimming Championships are open to Para swimmers who have a national classification or higher. If a swimmer has a provisional classification and has been confirmed a spot for national classification, that swimmer may still enter provided they meet the qualifying times.

Para swimmers may meet the qualification times in either a short course or long course pool. However, no converted time is allowed - i.e. so long as the time is met the swimmer can enter that event.

Heats and finals will take place for all events.

For events which are specific to certain classifications, priority will be given to swimmers whom the race is a Paralympic event - i.e. if an S10 swimmer wishes to compete in 200m free (a Paralympic event for S1-5 and S14) a final will only take place if a S1-5 or S14 swimmer is competing in it. If a final is run, the S10 swimmer may swim in the final and be eligible for medals. However, if there are 9 swimmers in the event, priority for qualification to the final will be given to the swimmer who's the event is a Paralympic event.

If there are enough S14 swimmers entered, Swimming New Zealand will seek to race them all together in their own standalone finals.

Medals will be distributed based on the World Para Swimming points system (similar to the percentage of the world record calculation).

### Relays

Relays will be timed-finals with all timed-finals being swum at the end of the finals session. Relay events can be entered by a national selection team (for selection purposes), a club team or a regional/zonal team. Priority of selection to teams will be in that order. Medals will be awarded to the top 3 clubs.

All athletes and spectators have agreed to allow photographs, videos, audio recordings and audio recording to be taken by accredited SNZ contractors to be used for any legitimate purpose by SNZ. Spectators agree upon entry that photographic, video or audio recording equipment is prohibited for any purpose which may include, without limitation, video and/or audio recorders, camera tripods, monopods or lenses with a total focal strength of greater than 300mm and commercial digital video equipment. The SNZ Event staff will, at their sole discretion, determine whether or not an item is intended for personal or commercial use.

## Athlete Information

### Pool Access

#### Swimmers

Access to the pool for all swimmers, coaches and team managers is via the swimmer's entrance at the far end of the building, **15min prior to warm up starting**. Accreditation must be presented to gain access. If you do not have a valid pass you will be required to pay the appropriate admission fee. Lost accreditation can be replaced at a cost of \$5.00 via the ticketing and accreditation booth located at the main entrance.

### Athlete Seating

Seating will be available on pool deck for swimmers, coaches and team managers as well as access to the grandstand seating. Please note that there will be no allocated seating. SNZ encourages everyone to fill up the seating overlooking the start/finish end of the competition end first and to not procure these seats by abandoning belongings.

SNZ asks swimmers to store their bags to the side of the warm-up pool hall rather than on seats in the competition pool hall.

### Strapping

Swimmers with strapping must provide documentation from a relevant registered health practitioner or physiotherapist and be reviewed by the Meet Director prior to swimming. Any swimmers without such documentation may not be permitted to swim.

### Marshalling Process

#### Heats:

Self-marshalling will be employed during all heat sessions. Swimmers are asked to be in the marshalling area 4 heats prior to their event. For all 50m events swimmers need to be in the marshalling area 6 heats prior to their event.

#### Finals:

Swimmers (including reserves) will need to marshal 6 races prior for 50m events and 4 races prior to their event for all other events and remain in the marshalling area. All swimmers are required to marshal for relays. Swimsuits will be checked at marshalling for legality.

### Winner Interviews

All A final winners in the evening sessions, as well as Age and Open Record breakers during all sessions will be asked to complete a short interview at the conclusion of the race.

### Victory Ceremonies

Medals shall be awarded for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd New Zealanders in all events - open and 17/18 years. Visitor medals will be awarded to any international competitor who places.

The Victory Ceremony Timetable will be included in the finals programmes, and we will endeavour to run to this timetable. If for any reason there is a delay in the results being available, the medal presentation for that event will take place as soon as possible.

#### Dress Standard for victory ceremonies:

- Club or Regional t-shirt, jacket or sweatshirt.
- No Caps or Goggles.
- No towels to be wrapped around the waist.

Swimmers who are not present will not receive their medal.

There is to be strictly no photography on pool deck and the medal presentation area, all photo's will be taken by the official event photographer and photo's will be made available on the SNZ Facebook page. Anyone taking photos in this area will be asked to leave immediately.

## Team Managers Information

### Accreditation

Clubs will need to complete the coaches and managers form for team personnel who are region attending the meet. Event passes will be allocated to clubs based on this information.

Accreditation must be worn, around the neck, to gain access to the pool. No accreditation no entry. Lost accreditation can be replaced at a cost of \$5.00 each.

Clubs are entitled to nominate coaches and team managers based on the number of swimmers they have competing as follows:

- 1-10 Swimmers = 2 coaches/managers
- 11-20 Swimmers = 3 coaches/managers
- 21-30 Swimmers = 4 coaches/managers
- 31+ Swimmers = 5 coaches/managers

Please note: late applications will incur a \$50 late fee for each individual

### Accreditation Criteria

Coaches must be registered with Swimming New Zealand under the member category 'Coach' and must be showing as financial and active in the Swimming New Zealand database.

Managers must be an active member on the Swimming New Zealand database. They can be registered as volunteer member and must have a

Police Vetting check completed on their SNZ profile. They are not permitted to be undertaking any coaching on pool deck.

Photo accreditation will be incorporated for this event, so a headshot or passport photo will be required to be included as part of the application process.

Anyone without accreditation will need to purchase a spectator ticket.

### Pool Access

#### **Coaches & Team Managers:**

Access to the pool for all swimmers, coaches and team managers is via the swimmer's entrance at the far end of the building. Accreditation must be presented to gain access. If you do not have a valid pass you will be required to pay the appropriate admission fee. Lost accreditation can be replaced at a cost of \$5.00 via the ticketing and accreditation booth located at the main entrance.

### Managers Meeting

There will be a compulsory team managers meeting held on Monday 5 April at 3pm at the venue, room to be confirmed.

Team managers will be given a brief run-down of meet activities, expectations of swimmers and clubs and general delivery of the event.

Each club must have at least one representative at the meeting to ensure all information is delivered back to the swimmers.

### Event Packs

Team event packs can be collected from the ticketing and accreditation booth located at the main reception from **9am on Monday 5 April 2021** and must be collected by team managers.

### Withdrawals

Withdrawals from events for session one will need to be submitted at the Team Managers meeting held the day prior to the start of the meet. Any withdrawals for session one submitted after the meeting will incur a withdrawal fee.

As ALL events in all morning sessions are run as timed finals SNZ Policy 008 will apply.

*For timed-finals, withdrawals must be advised by the end of the session preceding the session with the timed final event.*

Withdrawals from evening final races will be required to be submitted 30 minutes from posting of event results.

## Protests

Protests must be submitted to the referee, in writing, on the protest form by the team manager only within 30 minutes following the DQ announcement. This needs to be accompanied in cash by the \$100.00 protest fee.

If conditions causing a potential protest are noted prior to the event a protest must be lodged before the signal to start is given.

All protests shall be considered by the referee. If the referee rejects the protest, they must state the reasons for their decision. The regional Team Manager may appeal the rejection to the Jury of Appeal whose decision shall be final.

If the protest is rejected, the deposit will be forfeited to SNZ. If the protest is upheld the deposit will be returned.

## Session Programmes

Session programmes will be placed in regional boxes at the Resolution Desk. Relay and Withdrawal forms will be available from here also. Session programme numbers are based on the Coaches and Managers form.

## Timelines

Timelines will be included in both heats and finals session programmes. The times shown are

approximate and races may start before or after the times indicated. It is the swimmer's responsibility to be at marshalling at the appropriate time (i.e. 4 or 6 heats before the scheduled race).

## Banner Placement

Swimming New Zealand will have signage at the event and will take precedence for position over regional and club banners. SNZ Reserves the right to remove any banners that are not in appropriate areas or conflict with event signage and/or sponsors.

## Opening Ceremony

An opening ceremony will be held at the start of Session 3 on Tuesday 6 April starting at 7pm.

## Disqualifications

Disqualifications will be announced and a copy of the DQ form put in the regional boxes.
