On behalf of Swimming NZ and the events team in Auckland, welcome to the 2024 NZ Secondary School Swimming Championships being held next week. We are excited to be hosting this event at the Sir Owen G Glenn National Aquatic Centre, we can't wait to welcome you all!

To assist you with your final preparations, we have put together this document outlining all the key details you need to know about to help you across the championships. It promises to be an exciting week of racing and we look forward having you in Auckland.

Alongside looking forward to hosting the championships, we are also excited to welcome Kate Griffiths to our Swimming NZ team, who commences as our new Competitions Manager on Monday 22 July. She will be assisting with the delivery across the week, and you'll see her organising our competitions moving forward. Many of you may know Kate already, having been involved in swimming in Auckland for the past 9+ years.

As you'll be aware, our championships overlap with the racing in Paris. For those wishing to arrive early on Sunday 28 July, we will be showing the Day 1 Finals on the big screen in the venue with the doors opening earlier from 6.30am. It will be a great location to cheer on our Aquablacks with the Women's 400m Freestyle final (6.55am – Erika Fairweather & Eve Thomas) and Women's 100m Butterfly semi-final (6.30am – Hazel Ouwehand) if they qualify from the heats the night before. Please keep this in mind as it promises to be an exciting week in Paris.

The first day of competition is World Drowning Prevention Day. We are offering a 90secs float in partnership with Drowning Prevention Auckland to promote the importance of learning to swim, in which floating is a crucial step. Please join us in raising awareness on the first day of racing at 3pm as warm-up starts.

Thanks for being part of the championships, and best of luck for your final preparations and racing throughout the week. We can't wait to see you in Auckland.

Good Behaviour

Swimming New Zealand is committed to providing positive swimming experiences for all involved. Across the five days of competition, we trust that all interactions throughout the event will be positive and respectful – please treat others like you would like to be treated.

All participants must comply with our Code of Conduct – <u>learn more</u>

Health & Safety

Please remember to encourage good hygiene practices at this event and use common sense to keep yourself and others safe on pool deck.

Warm-Up Procedure

There will be allocated lanes for fins and paddles during warm up. We ask that you please stick to these lanes as displayed on pool deck.

Accred & Access To Pool

Access to the pool is via the accredited entrance via the scoreboard end of the pool (near the athletics track) with your accreditation. For those wishing to access the grandstand, you'll need to go through the changerooms and up the stairs/lift at the spectator entrance.















An accreditation volunteer will be on hand to ensure that passes are being presented. If you do not have a valid pass – you will be required to pay the appropriate admission fee.

Accreditation must be worn, around the neck, to gain access. No accreditation no entry. Lost accreditation can be replaced at a cost of \$15.00 each – through cash or invoice to the club.

Please note, no late passes will be issued at the door as per the updated Accreditation Policy 009.

Seating

Given the large number of swimmers for this championship, we have opted to organise a seating plan to ease the rush for securing seats for everyone's health and safety. Whilst we will assign areas for schools to be based around the facility, we ask that schools work together to comply and support each other to ensure everyone is catered for.

The seating plan will be completed in the coming days and uploaded on our event webpage prior to racing commencing.

Opening Ceremony

There will be an opening ceremony on Friday morning at 8:30am.

Parking

Parking is limited at the Sir Owen G Glenn National Aquatic Centre. Please try and limit the number of vehicles you travel in to the meet and comply with parking times and fees as per the signs displayed.

Session Timelines

The session timelines will be confirmed and available on Swimify in the days leading up to racing commencing.

Withdrawals

Withdrawals from events for session one will need to be submitted via email by 3pm or at the Team Managers meeting being held at 3pm on Thursday 25 July. Any withdrawals for session one submitted after this time will incur a 25 point deduction from the total school points as per Policy 008.

Any further withdrawals for sessions 2 - 6 will not be accepted via email after 3pm Thursday 25 July. Withdrawals need to be made via a withdrawals form which can be found at the resolutions desk located around the 25m turn on the grandstand side of pool deck.

As all events are run as timed final events the SNZ Policy 008 will apply. For timed-finals, withdrawals must be advised by the end of the session preceding the session with the timed final event.















DQs & Protests

Disqualifications will be announced and a copy of the DQ form will be available at the resolutions desk located halfway along the pool on the grandstand side.

Protests must be submitted to the referee, in writing, on the protest form by the team manager only within 30 minutes following the DQ result posting online. This needs to be accompanied in cash by the \$100.00 protest fee.

If conditions causing a potential protest are noted prior to the event a protest must be lodged before the signal to start is given.

All protests shall be considered by the referee. If the referee rejects the protest, they must state the reasons for their decision. The Team Manager may appeal the rejection to the Jury of Appeal whose decision shall be final.

If the protest is rejected, the deposit will be forfeited to SNZ. If the protest is upheld the deposit will be returned.

Anyone wishing to access the pool outside these times for training will need to contact the facility directly to book lane space.

Skins Event

The $5 \times 50 \text{m}$ skins event won't receive entries. The fastest 10 athletes from the 100 m IM for each of the skins age groups will form the field. We will spin the wheel prior to each leg of the skins competition to determine the swim stroke for that 50 m effort. Two swimmers will be removed per leg until we have two swimmers in the 5 th effort. The male event will run in entirety, followed by the female event. This event will be worth double points.

Please note that if you do not wish to swim in the Skins event, you must complete a withdrawal form within 30mins of swimming the 100m IM. No late withdrawals will be accepted. However, we strongly encourage swimmers to participate in the skins if you are ranked in the top 10 as double points are offered to the school.

Multi-Class Racing

These championships are open to Multi-Class and Para swimmers who have a classification of some form – provisional, national or international. Please note this includes S15, S18 and S19 classifications.

Medals will be distributed based on the World Para Swimming points system (similar to the percentage of the world record calculation) and equivalent for the alternative pathway classifications using the event software of which results are final. To confirm, this means that one set of medals will be presented for each respective Multi-Class timed final.

Relays

Male and female relays will be swum as timed-finals and in the age groups Under 16 (15&U) and 16 & Over. Younger swimmers can swim in the older age group, but older













swimmers cannot swim down. If an Under 16 (15&U) swimmer swims in the older age group, they cannot also swim in the younger age group of that event.

Mixed relays will be swum in the same age groups and teams must consist of 50% male and 50% female swimmers. Points from these races will not count towards top school relay trophies. Any mixed school relay teams will be swum as exhibition swims only and will not be eligible for points or medals.

Swimmers must be entered in individual events to be entered in relays.

The names of swimmers actually swimming on a relay must be submitted at least 45 minutes before the start of the session in which the event is to take place, in the order in which they are to swim. The names of swimmers in medley relay events must be listed for the respective strokes.

Failure to swim in the order listed will result in disqualification. Substitutions may be made only in the case of a documented medical emergency.

<u>Marshalling</u>

Self-marshalling will be employed during all sessions. Swimmers are asked to be in the marshalling area 4 heats prior to their event. For all 50m events swimmers need to be in the marshalling area 6 heats prior to their event.

Victory Ceremonies

Medals shall be awarded for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd swimmers/teams in all events (except exhibition relays).

The victory ceremony timetable will be included in the session programme on Swimify and as listed in the event schedule, and we will endeavour to run to this timetable. If for any reason there is a delay in the results being available, the medal presentation for that event will take place as soon as possible.

Dress standard and protocols for victory ceremonies:

- School t-shirt, jacket, or sweatshirt.
- Shorts, trousers, or skirts must be worn.
- Shoes must be worn.
- No caps or goggles.
- Swimmers can't run on to the podium late, they need to be present at the start of the announcement for their presentation.
- Swimmers must keep their medal on until well away from the podium and cameras.

Please note that photos taken by SNZ photographer will be made available for you to download and use.

Strapping

Swimmers with strapping must provide documentation from a relevant registered health practitioner or physiotherapist and be reviewed by the Technical Director (Carlrine Gillespie) prior to swimming. Any swimmers without such documentation may not be permitted to swim.

Accreditations

All accredited persons must have their accreditation on them and present their pass to access the competition building via the accredited entrance. Please wear your accreditation around your neck.

If a swimmer, coach or team manager is seen to be using somebody else's accreditation, this accreditation will be removed for the remainder of the event.

Please note that you won't be providing lanyards for 2024, so you'll need to bring your own for the championships.

Winner Interviews

We may conduct interviews with selected final winners during the championships, or NZ Age and NZ Open Record breakers.













Prior to Racing

Team Managers Meeting

There will be a compulsory team manager meeting held on Thursday 25 July at 3pm in the Finish Line Room. This is in the AUT Millennium building opposite the competition pool building. Head past the café and up the staircase to find the meeting room.

Team managers will be given a brief run-down of meet activities, expectations of swimmers and schools, and general delivery of the championships. Each school is asked to have at least one representative at the meeting. If you can't attend, please have a good understanding of this update.

Packs and passes must be collected from the accredited entrance from 2.30pm on Thursday. If the packs aren't collected then, they will be available to collect from the accredited entrance for the rest of the championships.

World Drowning Prevention Day

The first day of competition (Thursday 25 July) is also World Drowning Prevention Day. To mark this occasion, we will be encouraging everyone to participate in a 90secs float in the water at 3pm (start of warm-up). Being able to float is one of the crucial skills as part of learning to swim, which is one of the most important life skills you can learn.

Please factor this into your warm-up on Thursday afternoon and get involved to help increase awareness of the importance of learning to swim. We will be promoting this message through our comms channels on the day also.

Day 1 Finals from Paris

With our Aquablacks taking on the world in Paris on the final day of the championships, we will be opening the doors at 6.30am on Sunday 28 July and displaying the finals session from Paris on the big screen. We encourage everyone to arrive earlier as we will hopefully have some NZ swimmers to cheer on together:

6.30am – Women's 100m Butterfly Semi-Final (hopefully Hazel Ouwehand) 6.55am – Women's 400m Freestyle Final (hopefully Erika Fairweather & Eve Thomas)

Coaches Area
